The Chandigarh Police Operations Cell busted an international drug trafficking racket and seized narcotics worth approximately Rs. 1.25 crores (price as per international market) from the possession of three Nepalese nationals today.

A Quick Reaction team of Operations Cell headed by Sub Inspector Rohtash was conducting a routine checking at ISBT-43 in the wee hours today, in wake of the recent terrorist attacks in Hyderabad. During checking of certain suspicious looking people roaming at the ISBT-43, three persons were detained for checking. While checking, the police team searched their belongings and baggage and found narcotics weighing around 14 kilograms.

The contraband was checked with the narcotics test kits and it was identified as a high-potency drug — Charas. The three suspects were placed under arrest on charges of possessing and smuggling narcotics. A case was registered against them at police station-36, Chandigarh. The three identified themselves as Raju s/o Man Bahadur, VPO Patoli Naka District Dang, Nepal, Age 18 years; Jog Bahadur s/o Prem Bahadur, resident of VP Sukl Naka, PS Gadhwa District Dang, Nepal, Age 27 years; Sher Bahadur s/o Chij Bahadur, VPO Maharani Kola District Belati, Nepal, Age — 30 years. A case was registered against the three accused under Sections 20 NDPS Act.

In their preliminary interrogation, the accused revealed that they were paid Rs. 10,000 each by their kingpin — another Nepalese national (identity withheld for investigation reasons) for delivering the consignment to members of Indian drug mafia, active in Himachal Pradesh's various tourist destinations including Kullu, Manali, Shimla, Dharamsala and Dalhousie etc. On delivery of the consignment, they were to be paid Rs. 10,000 each more.

The three accused are being produced in the court for further interrogation, since the main conspirators and drug mafia suppliers are yet to be nabbed. The court shall be requested to grant their police remand so that the larger conspiracy could be unearthed and Indian and other Nepalese nationals active in drug-trafficking in India through international borders could be nabbed.
