ORDER

The appellant has preferred 1st appeal through online RTI portal vide no. PODEP/A/E/22/00076 dated 27.06.2022 against the reply/order of CPIO/Central in connection with his RTI application submitted through online RTI portal vide no. PODEP/R/E/22/00439 dated 15.06.2022 with the contention that access to information requested refused by CPIO.

INFORMATION SOUGHT IN RTI APPLICATION :-

The appellant vide his RTI application dated 15.06.2022 had sought copy of complaints along with all the attachments of 5 complaints bearing PWS Nos. 2020-08849, 2021-04505, 2021-06721, 2021-20985 and 2022-08618 filed by Mrs. Sanjana Vatts against the appellant.

Comments of CPIO/Central :-

Comments of CPIO/Central have been obtained who submitted that two RTI applications of the appellant were received in his office through online RTI portal vide nos. PODEP/R/E/22/00439 dated 15.06.2022 and PODEP/R/E/22/00456 dated 17.06.2022 on the same matter. Thereafter, requisite information was obtained from SHO PS Sector 11 and the appellant was informed vide letter nos. 175 & 182/RTI-22/CPIO/Central dated 22.06.2022 that out of 05 complaints filed by Sanjana Vatts, 03 complaints bearing PWS nos. 2021-04505, 2021-20985 & 2022-08618 against the appellant were received in PS Sector 11 and after completion of enquiry, two (02) complaints i.e. 2021-04505 and 2021-20985 were consigned to record and complaint bearing no. 2022-08618 was under inquiry at that time, hence, requisite information pertaining to this complaint was denied u/s 8(1)(h) of RTI act. So far as other two complaints bearing PWS nos. 2020-08849 & 2021-06721 are concerned, these complaints have not been received in his office and in this regard, the RTI application was already transferred to CPIO/CCIC by Nodal Officer RTI, PHQ, Sector 09, Chandigarh. Moreover, Nodal Officer has also transferred the RTI application to

The Department of Social Services is a new and growing agency of the State of New York. It was created by the Social Services Law, Chapter 100 of the Laws of 1960, and the Social Services Regulations, Chapter 100 of the Regulations of the State of New York, 1960. The Department is responsible for the administration and supervision of the social services provided by the State of New York.

ADMINISTRATIVE AND FINANCIAL OPERATIONS

The Department has a budget of approximately \$100 million for the year ending December 31, 1961. This budget is divided into two main categories: personnel and non-personnel. Personnel costs account for approximately 60% of the total budget, while non-personnel costs account for the remaining 40%.

The Department has a staff of approximately 1,000 employees. This staff is organized into several divisions, each responsible for a specific area of the Department's operations. The divisions are: Administration, Finance, Legal, Planning, and Social Services.

The Department's financial operations are managed by the Finance Division. This division is responsible for the preparation and execution of the Department's budget, as well as the collection and disbursement of funds.

The Department's personnel operations are managed by the Administration Division. This division is responsible for the recruitment, selection, and supervision of the Department's staff.

The Department's legal operations are managed by the Legal Division. This division is responsible for the representation of the Department in legal matters, as well as the review of the Department's policies and procedures for legal compliance.

The Department's planning operations are managed by the Planning Division. This division is responsible for the development and implementation of the Department's long-range plans and policies.

The Department's social services operations are managed by the Social Services Division. This division is responsible for the provision of social services to the people of the State of New York.

The Department's administrative operations are managed by the Administration Division. This division is responsible for the general management of the Department's affairs.

The Department's financial operations are managed by the Finance Division. This division is responsible for the collection and disbursement of funds.

CPIO/Hqrs in respect of two complaints which were consigned to record after completion of inquiry.

DECISION :-

I have gone through the contents of RTI application, appeal of the appellant, comments of CPIO/Central vis-à-vis material available on record which revealed that the instant online appeal has been filed by the appellant against CPIO/Central only and at the time of disposing of RTI application of the appellant, there was only 01 complaint i.e. bearing PWS no. 2022-08618 under inquiry with DSP/Central. The requisite information pertaining to this complaint was rightly denied by CPIO/Central u/s 8(1)(h) of RTI act being under inquiry at that time and the same is still pending for final decision.

The RTI application of the appellant was also transferred to CPIO/Hqrs and CCIC with respect to other four complaints concerning to them by Nodal Officer (RTI), PHQ, Sector 09, Chandigarh for disposal at their own level.

Henceforth, CPIO/Central is directed to supply the requisite information to the appellant as and when inquiry into the complaint bearing PWS no. 2022-08618 is finalized, as per RTI act.

The instant appeal stands disposed off accordingly.

In case, the appellant is not satisfied with the disposal of his appeal, he can file second appeal before the Hon'ble CIC, CIC Bhawan, Baba Gangnath Marg, Munirka, New Delhi-110067 under the RTI Act within 90 days.
